SECRETARY'S REPORT

Secretary Ciancio reported the Combined Life A&H benefit renewals for 2024 is a mess and is working with the broker and company directly to fix it; waiting on Service Award certifications from both companies; requested Board adopts Resolution 81 – Actuarial Equivalence; talked with 2481 and 2485 about annual requirement spreadsheet and emailed to officers to use as a template; cost for tower electricity has been removed from NYPA bill; working on finding online defensive driving course; had extensive phone call with Maxine Casalbore to assist her with completing paperwork for her to be the exclusive insurance broker for the district; received member training certificates for VFC #1 members from March 2023 – updated their records, luckily it did not affect their service award points as they had already made the minimum for 2023

CHIEF'S REPORT

It was moved on a motion made by Comrs. McCarthy/Ciancio to accept the Chief's report for February 2024. MC. Activity report for January 2024: alarms 37 for 376 hours; 2 drills for 57 hours; 4 meetings for 76 hours; misc. 12 for 167 hours. Total hours: 675.

Assistant Chief DiPrinzio reported 1/10 TL49 relocated to Fairview FD; 1/21 FAST call to Elmsford; 1/25 FAST call to Sleepy Hollow; the department will attend a memorial service for Julie Wright; requested permission to attend the following parades pending interest from members: 5/27 Memorial Day, 5/31 Pleasantville, 7/12 Mt. Kisco, 7/19

Thornwood, 8/21 Ossining; members were instructed not to enter Munger Pavilion unless instructed; 35 members attended department drill covering the workplace violence and sexual harassment requirement; discussed WMC construction and new buildings on Skyline Drive; fireworks at Kensico Dam 7/3; would like IamResponding screen repaired at district building; pictures for ID 2/28; working with 2483 to add inventory of the engines to RedNMX; received quote for RedNMX accountability program.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Comr. McCarthy reported he has found a buyer for E83 for \$27,500 and expired gear \$2,000; 2483 provided a new equipment request list for E82 before it can be in service; E81, 82 and 84 scheduled for service starting 2/21.

Comr. Sciliano reported upgrade of HVAC system has been completed.

Comr. Ciancio reported that when a driver is requested for the engine, it causes the siren to sound again; provided the list of alarms to CAD that would not be dispatched with the siren sounding; physicals and fit tests can be done at the same time through the scheduled onsite department physician; mics for portables have been installed; dinner for Comr. Deegan 2/17 at Casaletto; discussed refurbishing R59.

It was moved on a motion made by Comrs. Ciancio/McCarthy to accept the resignation of Michael Deegan from the Board of Fire Commissioners, with regret. MC.

It was moved on a motion made by Comrs. Sciliano/Ciancio to accept Resolution 81-Actuarial Equivalence. MC.
